





Enrollment: Total Students Enrolled

Numbers were at a historic low during the COVID-19 pandemic, but the past two years have seen a steady climb in attendance. As of September 2023 (not pictured), we have a waitlist for our English classes and tutoring program.

WHAT WE DO







English Language Learning (ELL) Classes

Our ELL classes focus on Brown County's highest need learners. We offer more than two dozen classes each semester at five levels, ranging from Literacy (students who cannot read or write in any language) to Level 2 (high beginner). Sessions are held in both the morning and the evening to better accommodate diverse schedules, and childcare is available to all learners. Once students complete Level 2 they can continue their studies at NWTC, which offers classes up to Level 6.

Family Literacy


Our College and Career Readiness (CCR) and CFFL (Children First Family Literacy) programs assist learners in developing their academic skills in preparation for high school equivalency diplomas, the GED® test series, or other academic and career goals. Classes are offered on-site at Literacy Green Bay, and literacy-focused childcare is available to all learners.

Adult Tutoring

Literacy Green Bay offers one-on-one tutoring to learners in Brown County and the Greater Green Bay Area. Learners get to work one-on-one with a trained Literacy Green Bay tutor. Goals for tutoring are set by the learner, such as attending college classes, getting library cards or drivers licenses, getting better jobs, or reading with their children.




